



#### Overview

Advancements in healthcare have ushered in a new wave of career opportunities. At the same time, more providers are seeking nurses with advanced education, specifically, a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing (BSN).

The BSN program provides a smooth transition for Registered Nurses furthering their education and careers, and serves the community and our society by meeting the need for increased numbers of highly skilled and knowledgeable nursing professionals.

At ECPI University's College of Nursing, we offer Registered Nurses the choice of a full-time or part-time option in pursing their BSN. Full-time students attend two online classes each term, beginning with one general education and one nursing course.

- Completion time for the full-time program is 45 weeks (9 terms, 2 classes per term) after all prerequisites are completed
- One course requires a practical experience (NUR456), one course (NUR444L) requires a virtual lab (30 hours), and one course requires lab practice (NUR340).

As a part-time student, you could take one course at a time which allows you to continue your education while fulfilling family and work responsibilities.

- Apply theories, interventions, and health promotion and disease prevention strategies to promote physically safe and healthy environments for culturally diverse individuals, families, and groups in a variety of community settings and situations.
- Apply knowledge and skills specific to roles in education, clinical practice, or informatics for professional practice and career advancement.
- Demonstrate accountability and responsibility to nursing practice and value learning and reflective practice.
