#### Guaranteed Admission Agreement between ECPI University and Paul D Camp Community College for the

BS Computer and Information Science with a major in Cyber Security and Network Security

#### I. Overview

ECPI University and Paul D Camp Community College, recognizing the need to facilitate the admission of transfer students from Paul D Camp Community College to ECPI University as they pursue a bachelor's degree in Computer and Information Science with a concentration in Cyber and Network Security, resolve to adopt a guaranteed admission agreement (GAA). Paul D Camp Community College students who do not meet the terms described herein may still apply and be considered for admission, although admission is not guaranteed.

Paul D Camp Community College graduates who participate in this GAA will be able to complete a BS degree in an accelerated time frame (as long as the student is available to take two classes per term). They will also have access to career services advising.

#### II. Agreement

#### A. General Admission Requirements and Eligibility

To be guaranteed admission under this GAA, a Paul D Camp Community College student must graduate with a General Education Certificate and/or Hardware and Software Support Certificate from Paul D Camp Community College within five years of his/her application to ECPI University and meet all of the ECPI University admission requirements below. These students are referred to as "GAA students."

To be admitted under the terms of this agreement, GAA students must:

- a. Complete an interview with an admissions representative.
- Submit official transcripts for all academic work completed including documentation of an earned certificate in Hardware and Software Support and/or General Education from Paul D Camp Community College.
- c. Earn a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher in the certificate(s).
- d. Achieve a C or better in all courses applied to the degree and have completed all courses applied to the degree within the past ten years. No distinction will be made for courses earned through dual enrollment, Advanced Placement or CLEP.

Students who transfer from Paul D Camp Community College through this program will receive a 20% reduction in per semester charge for full time registration. This does not include book or learning resource charges.

The ECPI University application fee for Paul D Camp Community College students will be waived.

#### B. Summary of Transfer Credits

The ECPI University's Cyber Security BS degree program is 120 credit hours.

- 3. Communicate with ECPI University representatives and the Computer Information Systems (CIS) Program Director to discuss proposed changes in the Paul D Camp Community College program, which might impact or after this agreement.

#### D. Responsibilities of ECPI University

- 1. Provide academic advising services to GAA students during the two terms prior to transfer to assist these students in making a smooth transition from the community college to ECPI University.
- 2. Provide tracking data on performance of transfer students at ECPI University, including credits presented and accepted in transfer, ECPI University courses attempted and completed, cumulative GPA, major, graduation date from ECPI University, and comparisons with native students. The specific data elements of the report will be determined by Institutional Research staffs from Paul D Camp Community College and ECPI University and provided by July 1 of each year.

#### E. Responsibilities of the Student

- 1. Review and accept ECPI University policies and Information Technology -specific policies, if applicable, which are published in the ECPI University official catalog.
- 2. Follow the ECPI University application and admission processes and timelines and apply through www.ECPI University.edu/PaulDCampuCommunityCollege.

#### F. Review of the GAA

- 1. The Paul D Camp Community College will designate officials who will be responsible for all aspects of the GAA at the Paul D Camp Community College. ECPI University will designate individuals responsible for all aspects of the GAA at ECPI UNIVERSITY.
  - a. Representing ECPI University will be the University President or designees,
  - b. Representing the Paul D Camp Community College will be the College President or designees.
- 2. Any changes, additions, or deletions to this agreement shall be made only after consultation with an agreement among officials at both institutions. Changes will not adversely affect students already enrolled under the provisions of the existing GAA. A revised agreement will be signed by official at both institutions.

- 3. Both parties will communicate the conditions of the GAA to their respective clientele (external and internal constituents).
- 4. ECPI University and Paul D Camp Community College will review the GAA at a minimum of every three years and make adjustments or amendments as deemed appropriate to maintain the integrity of each institution as well as for the improvement of the transfer process and student articulation. Such changes will not adversely affect students already enrolled and covered under the provisions of the existing GAA.
- 5. The GAA will remain in effect until terminated by either party upon written notice to the other party of an intention to terminate. Such notice should be given at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination, and students who entered under the GAA may take advantage of its terms for two years after termination becomes effective.
